### Dear Fraser Families

The beginning of the year is a very important time for our students, as staff establish routines, expectations and revisit the SCARF values. I have been very impressed with the quality of work already being produced by our students and by the level of enthusiasm and excitement in every unit. ### Primary Car Park and Preschool Carpark

Thank you to all those parents and carers who park safely in either of our car parks. Safety is always the paramount concern in and around car parks. I would ask that drivers follow all car park signage in order to make drop off and pick up times as safe as possible for all families. I would request only cars with the required permit use our disabled car spaces, as these spaces are essential for the safety of our students and community members.

### Learning Community Information Sessions (next week)

Next week, we will be hosting Information Sessions for parents/carers of students in Years 1-6 to visit their child's learning environment. Teaching teams will introduce themselves and provide a brief introduction to the program and procedures for their learning communities in 2018. These sessions will run from 8.30am-8.55am, with Year 3/4 on Tuesday 13 February, Year 1/2 on Wednesday 14 February and Year 5/6 on Thursday 15 February. Kindergarten and Preschool held their Information Sessions in term 4 2017. Further opportunities will be advertised as the year progresses. Finally, thank you to all our fabulous Fraser community members for your support, appreciation and kind words during the week. The staff and I really value your support and ongoing feedback. We look forward to a fabulous year ahead.

# Staying Safe at Fraser Primary School

## Before School

Supervision on the playground and in the library before school begins at 8.30am. Please do not send your child to school before this time unless they are involved in our Before School Care program. The senior and junior playground equipment are not before school play areas. Please note, any students who are at school before 8.30am will be asked to sit in the sheltered area outside the canteen foyer.

## Bike Safety

At least 30-60 students ride their bikes to school each day. Cyclist safety is paramount for all children and adults. ACT Police recommend that children below the age range of Year 3 and 4 should not ride a bike without an adult riding/walking alongside. This is because children don't develop the ability to gauge distances accurately until about 8 or 9 years old. All students riding to school should wear a correctly fitted helmet. Bikes/scooters should be stored in the bike enclosure and students are encouraged to use a bike lock to secure their bike/scooter to the fence. Students should walk their bike or scooter once on the school grounds. Please talk with your child/ren about crossing the road safely by using the underpass.



## Going Home

School finishes at 3.00pm each day. All students should go immediately home, to their bus stop or to After School Care. Please check that each day your children know how they are to get home and where your meeting place is. If your child has any changes to their after school routine, please let your child's teacher know, or contact the Front Office well before the end of the day.

## Tillyard Drive Underpass and Pedestrian Crossing

We thank you for parking at the Fraser shops, it certainly helps to reduce the congestion in the front car park. We would ask you to then use the underpass with your children to model safe crossing of a very busy road. Using the underpass is the safest option for crossing Tillyard Drive.



## Preschool Car Park Drop Off/Pick Up

Please only park in designated spaces. For children's safety do not mount the gutters and park on grass areas. If you are using the Preschool car park, we ask you to queue in the entrance of the car park if no car spaces are available and please do not overtake cars waiting in the line for a space.



## Main Car Park

Thank you for ensuring the flow of traffic continues through the car park. Students may only get into a car from where Mark, Linda or other Fraser Primary School staff are waiting. Students must not walk up through the car park driveway and get into a car.

## Bringing Valuables To School

Students should not bring valuable items and toys to school. They can be lost or broken which causes distress. Mobile phones need to be handed in, in the classroom (Year 5/6) or to the Front Office for all other year levels.

## Sun Safety

Fraser Primary School is a *SunSmart* school. All students are required to wear a brimmed hat year round, except for the months of June and July. Students without a hat will be asked to stay in a designated shaded area. If your child's hat has a chin strap attached, please cut this off as it may become tangled in playground equipment or caught up in play. Could you also please support your child to apply sunscreen before coming to school each day. Sunscreen is also provided at school, please see information on page 4 of the newsletter.



## Safety Fence

Gates are closed between 9.30 am and 2.30pm. All visitors are to come via the Front Office during this time.

## Picking Up Your Child During School Hours

If you need to pick up your child during school hours, please enter through the Front Office and speak to the office staff about why you are at school. After you have collected your child, please go back via the Front Office where staff will sign your child out. If your child is returning to school later in the day, please see the Front Office where staff will sign your child back in.



## Tree Safety

Students are not to climb trees on the school grounds before, during or after school.

# P&C AGM WEDNESDAY 28 MARCH 6.00PM IN THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

We would like to encourage as many of our school community to attend our upcoming Parents & Citizens (P&C) Annual General Meeting (AGM). The P&C is a great way to meet other families, have input into the events that take place at the school and to participate in the fundraising that enables resources to be purchased to support the fabulous education students at Fraser Primary School benefit from.

We have many parents/carer whose last child has left our school, after many years of supporting the P&C. We are in need of new families to participate in 2018.

Joining the P&C is a great way to keep informed, to contribute to the quality education of your children and to make new friends. Grandparents are also encouraged to become actively involved with the school's P&C. Your contribution can be as large or small as you can manage, but your ongoing support of the P&C is invaluable. Not only will you be supporting the school community but you will be supported by the school community. You can learn new skills and gain a clear understanding of how the school operates. This is a great opportunity to share in the school's decision-making process and shape the future.

The P&C is the overarching committee for Before and After School Care, the Canteen and the Creative Arts Program.

School P&C Associations appoint committee members and an executive committee at their AGM. Generally, an executive committee consists of a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, public officer and P&C delegate to Council. These positions are responsible for organising various components of the P&C and are aided by committee members.

## Positions within the P&C

### Committee member

- a member of the school community (parent, carer, grand-parent etc) who participates in the activities of the P&C (excluding positions listed below).

### President

- provides leadership
- chairs all general and executive committee meetings of the association
- acts as a spokesperson for the association
- reports to Parents and Citizens Association meetings about the activities of the P&C
- supervises the functions of other office bearers
- ensures adequate and efficient communication exists between the members of the association and the members of the school board
- encourages parents/carer to participate.

### Vice President

- steps into the role of the President should the President be unavailable, and undertakes ad hoc tasks to reduce the workload of the President.

### Secretary

- draws up, in consultation with the President, meeting agendas
- keeps full and correct minutes of the P&C's proceedings
- acts upon decisions as directed by the meeting
- attends to the inwards and outwards correspondence of the association
- looks after the association's documents

- maintains a register of financial and ex-officio members if applicable.

### Treasurer

- responsible for the recording of all funds received and expended by the association
- banks funds received by the association
- prepares regular financial reports for P&C meetings
- prepares the association's annual financial statements to ensure the P&C and its business areas annual financial statements are audited in time for the AGM

### Public officer

- a role with some infrequent but formal reporting obligations
- often this position is fulfilled by the President.

### P&C delegate to Council

- a member of the school Council

## JAPANESE NEWS

Each year Fraser Primary School is fortunate to be able to host a Japanese university student who volunteers his/her time to help out in our Japanese program and provides our students and families with the chance to interact with a native speaker and learn first-hand about Japanese culture. The continuing success of our Japanese Teaching Assistant program relies on kind Fraser Primary School families being willing to host our assistants in their homes.

Previous host families have said of their experience:

*'This is the second Japanese assistant that we have had stay with us, and it has been an absolute joy to have her. Not only have we had the opportunity to learn more about Japanese culture and practice our Japanese (which the kids are great at but I am terrible!), it has been great for us as a family to share our space with someone and allow them to become a part of us.'*

*'We loved having her stay with us it was a fantastic experience and she became a family member instantly. We would certainly be a host family again!'*

This year we will be hosting Kenshiro Iwashita. He comes from the University of Kagoshima, and will be beginning in term 2 and continuing until the end of the school year.

Our assistant will need his own bedroom but can share a family bathroom. He pays his host families a contribution each week to cover meals and board but is expected to pay his own entertainment expenses. Kenshiro will need transport to school each day (unless you are within walking distance).

Generally our families offer to host for a period of 6-10 weeks during terms 2, 3 or 4 which may or may not include the holiday periods.




- 5 Choose payment type.  
When done, click **NEXT**

or click **PAYMENT SUMMARY**
- 6 **SUBMIT ORDER**

Remember: Submit your **LOOP** orders at the same time so all books arrive together.
