FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Fraser Families

Welcome to the 2019 school year at Fraser Primary School. What a wonderful start we had on Monday with our Preschool and Kindergarten students, on Thursday with our Preschool students and on Tuesday with all our students in Years 1-6. It was great to see so many smiling and enthusiastic students ready for another year. Staff are now busily getting to know their new students and everyone has had an enjoyable and productive week. The beginning of the year is a very important time for our students, as staff establish routines, expectations and revisit our SCARF values. I have been very impressed with the quality of work already being produced by our students and by the level of enthusiasm and excitement in every unit. The smooth transition for all students has certainly been supported through the Moving Up Day at the end of last year and the fabulous relationships which have formed since then between students and staff.

New Displays in the Canteen Foyer

You may notice as you walk through the canteen foyer new displays on each of the two walls. To the left is our new SCARF values interactive display. Staff will be using this to help our students understand and further enact our SCARF values. A large screen TV will also be mounted on the display and staff will use this screen to exhibit images of students displaying SCARF values. The display has already created a great deal of interest amongst the students. On the right you will see a large image of our school plan that includes strategies and actions that we will focus on in 2019. I would encourage you all to view the new displays as you walk through the school and discuss them with your children and classroom teachers in the coming weeks.

Working in Partnership

Our teachers value the home/school connection and building positive partnerships with parents and carers is critical to student success at school. Teachers have spent time this week talking to families to commence this partnership and will continue this over the coming weeks either in person, via a phone call, letter or email. You will receive a *Parent/Carer Communication Form* to complete and send back to school to help your child's teacher get to know your child. Please take the time to complete this form, or alternatively you could write an open letter to your child's teacher.

Learning Community Information Sessions (next week)

Next week, we will be hosting Information Sessions for parents/carers of students in Years 1-6 to visit their child's learning environment. Teaching teams will introduce themselves and provide a brief introduction to the program and procedures for their learning communities in 2019. These sessions will run from 8.30am-8.55am, with Year 2 on Tuesday 12 Feb, Years 3/4 on Tuesday 19 Feb, Year 1 on Wednesday 20 Feb, and Years 5/6 Thursday 21 Feb. Preschool and Kindergarten held their Information Sessions in term 4 2018. Further opportunities will be advertised as the year progresses. Finally, thank you to all our fabulous Fraser Primary School community members for your support, appreciation and kind words during the week. The staff and I really value your support and ongoing feedback. We look forward to a fabulous year ahead.

Staying Safe at Fraser Primary School

Before School

Supervision on the playground and in the library before school begins at 8.30am. Please do not send your child to school before this time unless they are involved in our Before School Care program. The senior and junior playground equipment are not before school play areas. Please note, any students who are at school before 8.30am will be asked to sit in the sheltered area outside the canteen foyer.

Bike Safety

At least 30-60 students ride their bikes to school each day. Cyclist safety is paramount for all children and adults. ACT Police recommend that children below the age range of Year 3 and 4 should not ride a bike without an adult riding/walking alongside. This is because children don't develop the ability to gauge distances accurately until about 8 or 9 years old. All students riding to school should wear a correctly fitted helmet. Bikes/scooters should be stored in the bike enclosure and students are encouraged to use a bike lock to secure their bike/scooter to the fence. Students should walk their bike or scooter once on the school grounds. Please talk with your child/ren about crossing the road safely by using the underpass.



Going Home

School finishes at 3.00pm each day. All students should go home immediately, to their bus stop or to After School Care. Please check that each day your children know how they are to get home and/or where your meeting place is. If your child has any changes to their after school routine, please let your child's teacher know, or contact the Front Office well before the end of the day. Phone calls just before 3.00pm are difficult to deliver on time.

Tillyard Drive Underpass and Pedestrian Crossing

We thank you for parking at the Fraser shops, it certainly helps to reduce the congestion in the front car park. We would ask you to then use the underpass with your children to model safe crossing of a very busy road. Using the underpass is the safest option for crossing Tillyard Drive.



Preschool Car Park Drop Off/Pick Up

Please only park in designated spaces. For children's safety do not mount the gutters and park on grass areas. If you are using the Preschool car park, we ask you to queue in the entrance of the car park if no car spaces are available and please do not overtake cars waiting in the line for a space.



Main Car Park

Thank you for ensuring the flow of traffic continues through the car park, by moving forward as pick up spaces become available. Students may only get into a car from where Mark, Linda or other Fraser Primary School staff are waiting. Students must not walk up through the car park driveway and get into a car. Please stay in your car in the pick up zone.

Bringing Valuables to School

Students should not bring valuable items and toys to school. They can be lost or broken which causes distress. Mobile phones need to be handed in, in the classroom (Year 5/6) or to the Front Office for all other year levels.

Sun Safety

Fraser Primary School is a *SunSmart* school. All students are required to wear a brimmed hat year-round, except for the months of June and July. Students without a hat will be asked to stay in a designated shaded area. If your child's hat has a chin strap attached, please cut this off as it may become tangled in playground equipment or caught up in play. Could you also please support your child to apply sunscreen before coming to school each day. Sunscreen is also provided at school, please see information on page 4 of the newsletter.

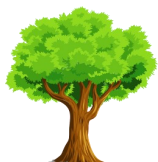


Safety Fence

Picking Up Your Child During School Hours

If you need to pick up your child during school hours, please enter through the Front Office and speak to the office staff about why you are at school. After you have collected your child, please go back via the Front Office where staff will sign your child out. If your child is returning to school later in the day, please go via the Front Office where staff will sign your child back in. Starting school is a big step for you and your child. You can both experience a wide range of emotions from excitement and happiness to anxiety and sadness, however, for most children and parents/carers, starting school is a smooth process.

Parents/carers play a powerful role in a child’s success at school by sharing a positive and enthusiastic attitude to school. This can be done by talking about your positive times at school, by reading books to your child that present school in a positive way and by encouraging your child to talk to other children who are enjoying their time at school.

Talking to your child about his or her feelings and teaching them *emotion management skills*, such as calm breathing and focusing, can also ease your child’s transition to school and help them cope with life in general.

Developing a positive home-school relationship by regular communications with teachers and the school community can help reduce your anxieties and those of your child.

For some parents/carers the question “What did you do at school today?” can elicit varying responses from “Nothing” to elaborate details. Some parents/carers find it useful to ask more open-ended questions about what was the best part of the day or about what went well for them.

Some of the new tasks your child may be facing are new classroom routines, a new teacher, being with new children as well as some familiar friends, and a new classroom environment.

Be encouraged that most children settle quickly into new routines, and classroom teachers are experienced at handling any upsets. Keep an eye out for information about items your child needs to bring to school so that a written list or a pictorial list can be displayed at home and your child can learn to check this daily as part of their morning routine.

Also remember that a good night’s sleep is important for your child to function well at school. Please let your child’s teacher know if you have any continuing concerns.

Fraser Primary School has recently completed its *SunSmart* three year review and received our *SunSmart* certificate. To view the *SunSmart* policy please visit the Fraser Primary School website.

Some important information to note:

- **Sunscreen** will be available for all students to use in their units. If your child is allergic to any sunscreens please inform the Front Office, and supply sunscreen that is appropriate
- From August through to May students are asked to wear a broad brimmed hat. If students do not bring a hat to school they are asked to play under the shelter outside their unit
- The *SunSmart* Widget is now on the Fraser Primary School website. It shows the level of UV for the day and the level of protection required
- At the start of this year, all units will be discussing how to be sun safe following the 5 *SunSmart* Steps.
